WHAT IS

HOME CARE TRAINING (HCTC)?

Formerly known as Therapeutic Foster Care, HCTC is an innovative team approach provided by experienced, skilled professionals through a family-based treatment environment for severely troubled and traumatized children as an alternative to institutional care.



HOME CARE TRAINING (HCTC)

is a model of care that provides:

- A nurturing family with active structured treatment.
- A safe, nurturing, and stable environment for a youth with social and/or emotional challenges.
- An alternative to residential or institutional care.
- Support for the child's relationship with their family.

WHY BECOME AN HCTC PARENT?

Home Care Training is an opportunity to make a lasting difference in the life of a child. Your stable, structured home can be the ideal setting for a child to learn, grow and change.

Youth with behavioral health problems can benefit from living with an adult who has the time, patience and training to teach new skills. A home where youth can build trusting relationships, practice decision making, and learn more successful ways of interacting with others.

SUPPORT FOR HCTC PARENTS:

- Extensive pre-service training
- A Child & Family Team focused on each child's unique needs
- A counselor on call 24 hours a day /7 days a week
- Ongoing training and peer support with other HCTC provider homes
- Regular in-home support from a professional counselor
- Respite opportunities
- Professional level pay for your professional expertise

HOME CARE TRAINING (HCTC) is administered by NARBHA and is a covered behavioral health service in the continuum of out-of-home treatment settings. It is designed to be intensive, time limited (usually 12-18 months), and focused on addressing the behaviors that prevent the child or youth from succeeding in his or her home and community.

WHAT'S REQUIRED TO GET STARTED?

HCTC parents work as a part of a Child and Family Team which includes: the child, family, clinic, and other agency and natural supports.

- At least 21 years of age
- Have at least one year of foster care experience or behavioral health equivalent
- Fingerprinting/background check
- Willing to accept the challenges of working with children with difficult behaviors
- Be willing to provide a full-time parenting environment
